The Newbery Medal is awarded annually by the Association for Library Service to Children. It is given to the author of the most distinguished contribution to American children's literature published the preceding year. The medal is named in honor of John Newbery, an English publisher and bookseller (1713–1767). He was the first person to print books especially for children, such as Mother Goose's Melody and Goody Two Shoes. The award was established in 1921 by publishers Frederic G. Melcher and R.R. Bowker Co.


