Chen, Nicole. Lily Xiao Speaks Out. It's 1993 and Lily dreams of playing in a grunge band with her cool cousin.

Cheng, Jack. The Many Masks of Andy Zhou. Sixth grader Andy Zhou grapples with fitting in, befriends a bully, drifts apart from his childhood best friend, and gets to know grandparents who have just moved from Shanghai to live with his family.

Chokshi, Roshani. The Spirit Glass. Corazon yearns to finally start training as a babaylan (a mystical healer and spirit guide) under her powerful guardian.



Chow, Karen S. Miracle. When her father dies, Amie's ability to play the violin dies, too. Nothing short of a miracle can bring back what she has lost.

DasGupta, Sayantani. The Chaos Monster (series). Ten-year-old Kinjal and his twin sister, Kiya, are amazed when flying horses appear and insist on taking them to a place they have never heard of: the Sky Kingdom.

Faruqi, Reem. Call Me Adnan. Adnan dreams of making it to the Ultimate Table Tennis championship, but when tragedy strikes, he loses his passion for playing.

Faruqi, Saadia. The Partition Project. When her grandmother arrives from Pakistan, Mahnoor learns about Dadi's childhood in northern India and the Partition that forced her to leave her home.

Hamza, Nina. Samira's Worst Best Summer. When a seventh grader's favorite tree gets toilet-papered, it's the catalyst for either her worst or best summer ever.

Hemnani, Ritu. Lion of the Sky. A novel in verse set in 1947 during the tumultuous days of the Partition.

Hiranandani, Veera. Amil and the After. In 1948, 12-year-old Amil, who is both Muslim and Hindu, struggles to find his place in Bombay, India.

Ireland, Meredith. Emma and the Love Spell. Twelve-year-old Korean American Emma uses her fickle witchy powers to keep her best friend's parents together so they do not move away.

Kadarusman, Michelle. We the Sea Turtles: A Collection of Island Stories. Short stories in which turtles play a role in emotional turning points in young lives.

Kagawa, Julie. Storm Dragons: Lightningborn. In a world in the clouds where only the rich own dragons, a poor boy named Remy finds a wild baby dragon —believed to be extinct—and becomes the focus of an evil pirate's vengeance.

Kelkar, Supriya. The Cobra's Song. Geetanjali knows she'll never sing like her mother or grandmother, famous classical singers from India. After freezing on stage during a concert, Geetanjali adds "fear of singing" to her list of fears.

Keller, Tae. Mihi Ever After (series). When she and her new friends discover a portal to a fairy tale realm, Mihi Whan Park finally gets her shot at being a princess.

Khan, Hena. Drawing Deena. When aspiring artist Deena's anxiety reaches a breaking point, both she and her mother learn the importance of asking for help.

Kim, Jessica. Make a Move, Sunny Park! Seventh-grader Sunny struggles when she makes the school dance team and her best friend does not.

Lại, Thanhhà. When Clouds Touch Us. A novel in verse inspired by the author's experience follows Hà and her family, refugees from the Vietnam War, as they move to Texas for a new job. Despite not wanting to start over again, Hà discovers unwanted change can bring opportunity.

LaRocca, Rajani. Sona and the Golden Beasts. Discovering a wolf pup she believes is related to the sacred beasts of Devia, Sona embarks on an epic adventure.

Lee, Julie. In the Tunnel. Fourteen-year-old Myung-gi flees North Korea with his family during the height of the devastating Korean War, beginning an epic struggle for survival that pushes them to the brink.
