Cohen, Emi Watanabe. *Golem Crafters*. Faye has a tough time concentrating in school and struggles to find her voice in her competitive, bi-racial family. Then their uncle and cousin from the Jewish side arrive unannounced to say that it's time the children learn the secret family magic: Golem Crafting.

Kelly, Erin Entrada. *The First State of Being.* It's August 1999. For twelve-year-old Michael, life is ordinary, except for the looming Y2K crisis and his overwhelming crush on his fifteen-year-old babysitter. When a disoriented teenage boy appears out of nowhere, Michael discovers there is more to life than stockpiling supplies.

Khan, Hena. **Drawing Deena**. When aspiring artist Deena's anxiety reaches a breaking point, both she and her mother learn the importance of asking for help.

Khan, Hiba Noor. **Safiyyah's War.** When her father is arrested by the Nazis for his secret Resistance work, it falls to Safiyyah to run dangerous errands around Paris. Can she find the courage to enter the treacherous catacombs under the city and lead hundreds of persecuted Jews to safety?

Khan, M.T. *Amir and the Jinn Princess.* After his mother goes missing, twelve-yearold Amir teams up with the jinn princess Shamsa to find her.

Kim, Graci. **Dreamslinger.** For her safety, Aria lives at the Resthaven Home for Dreamslingers, a haven for children born with a genetic mutation that transports them to a powerfully magical realm while they sleep. But this magic can be unpredictable—even deadly!

Kim, Jessica. **On Thin Ice.** Fraternal twins Phoebe and Dexter reluctantly partner up for Phoebe's figure skating competition when Dexter is cut from the hockey team.

Krishnaswami, Uma. *Birds on the Brain.* Bird lover Reeni is on a quest to save her city's bird count event when the mayor tries to shut it down.

Lại, Thanhhà. *When Clouds Touch Us.* A novel in verse inspired by the author's experience follows Hà and her family, refugees from the Vietnam War, as they move to Texas for a new job. Despite not wanting to start over again, Hà discovers unwanted change can bring opportunity.

LaRocca, Rajani. *Sona and the Golden Beasts.* Discovering a wolf pup she believes is related to the sacred beasts of Devia, Sona embarks on an epic adventure.

Lee, Julie. *In the Tunnel.* Fourteen-year-old Myung-gi flees North Korea with his family during the height of the devastating Korean War, beginning an epic struggle for survival that pushes them to the brink.

Lee, Lori. *Pahua and the Soul Stealer* (series). After an angry spirit steals her brother's soul, lonely 11-year-old Hmong girl Pahua Moua must find her way through the spirit worlds to save him—discovering her true destiny along the way.

Li, Christina. *Ruby Lost and Found.* Thanks to her Ye-Ye's epic scavenger hunts, thirteen-year-old Ruby Chu knows San Francisco like the back of her hand. But after his death, she feels lost, and it seems like everyone is abandoning her.


